


National coordination

Barriers

Further publication

For further publication three barriers exist.

- Political barrier: Greater engagement of politicians in promoting the Open Data paradigm at all levels of central, regional and municipal level is needed
- Legal barrier: Old legislations still exist that are in contrast with new principles of Open Data.
- Financial barrier: Many public administrations operate in limited budget regimes.

For further use an other barriers is present.

• Other barrier: Poor quality of metadata and data itself.



Best practices

- **ISTAT**: Organization publishes statistical data on population and housing census as Linked Open Data. Availability of the data facilitates development of new applications and services that may have societal impact.
- OpenCoesione school: an innovative interdisciplinary teaching method for the second level of secondary schools. It promotes awareness through monitoring activity of public funding and use of technologies of information and communication published on the portal OpenCoesione.





Progress on barriers


- The financial barrier existing for further publication, was addressed. To overcome this barrier working groups were established in order to govern the actions of the public administrations on open data based on European funds.
- The team has started defining a common metadata profile fully compliant with the European one to address the barrier for further use.











Major changes 2016

- Presence of Open Data indicator shows a decrease. This is due the fact that more regional portals have been identified, but only few of them are integrated in the national portal.
- The Impact of Open Data has increased. This can be explained because one study about market value of Open Data has been conducted.
- The Use of Open Data has increased due to a higher percentage of data sets now being machine readable and because of typical profile of visitors is now known.
