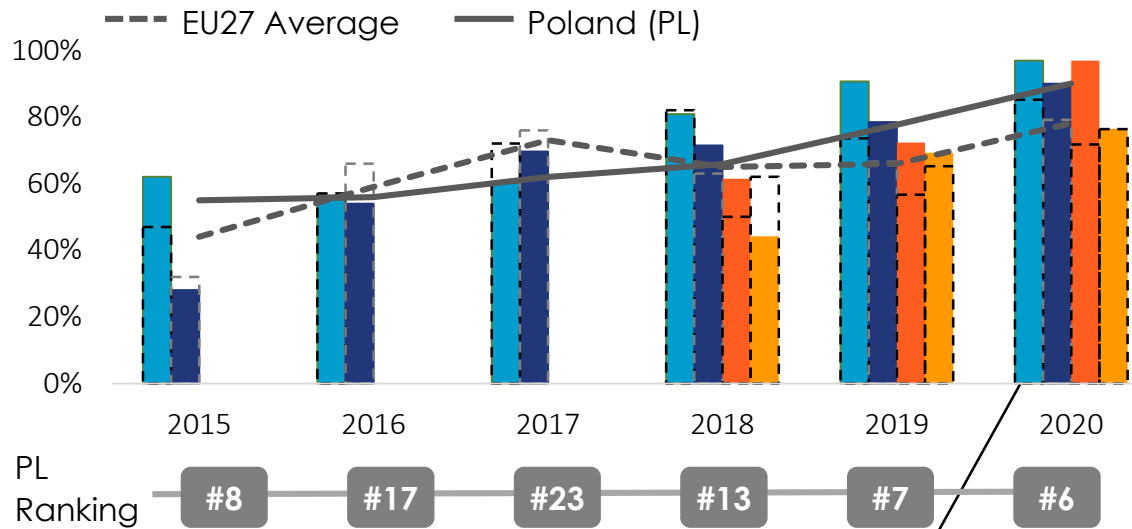

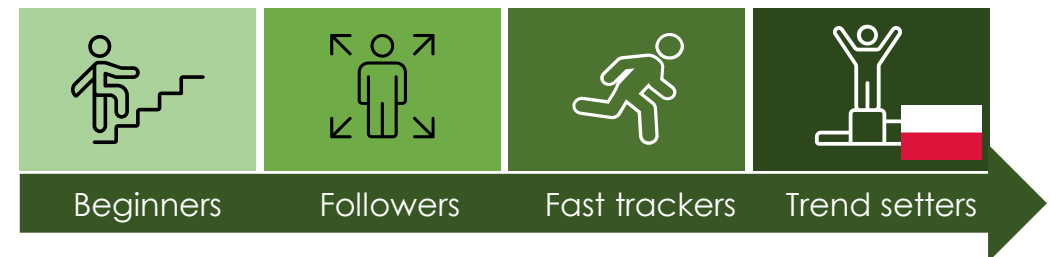
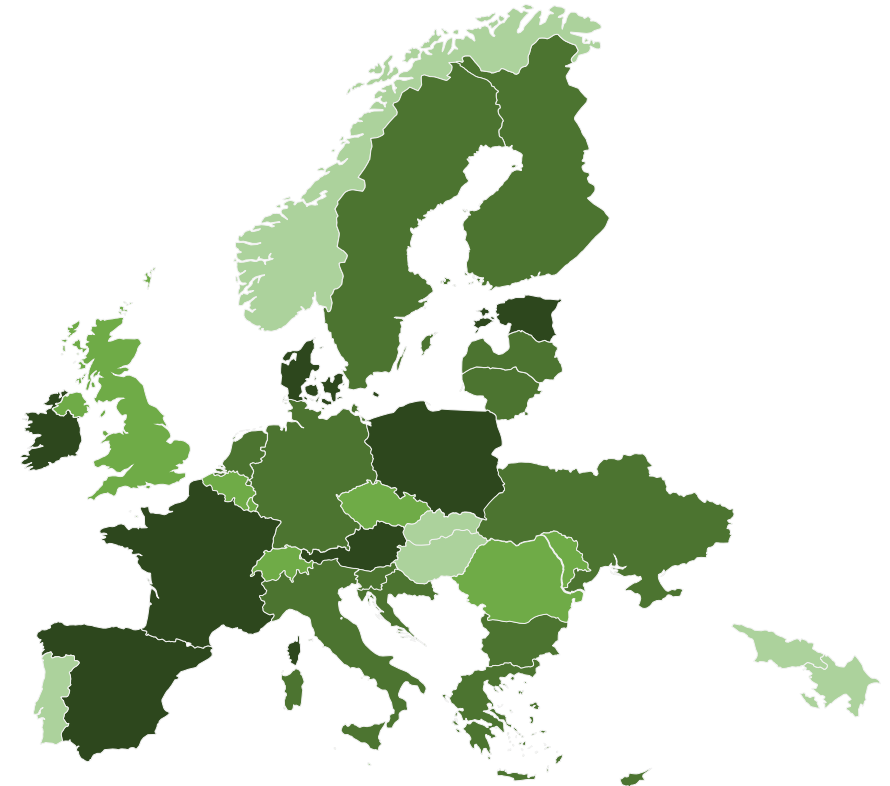

OVERALL MATURITY LEVEL SEGMENTATION

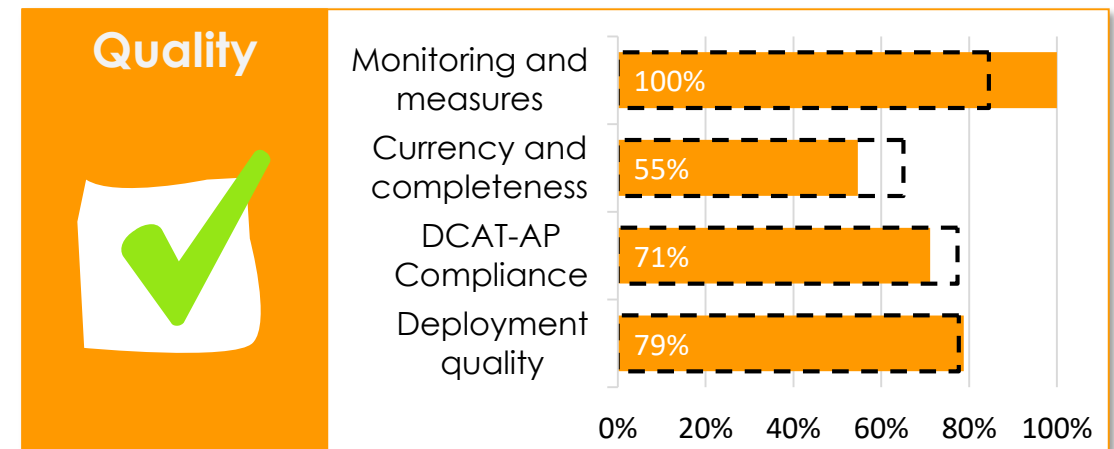
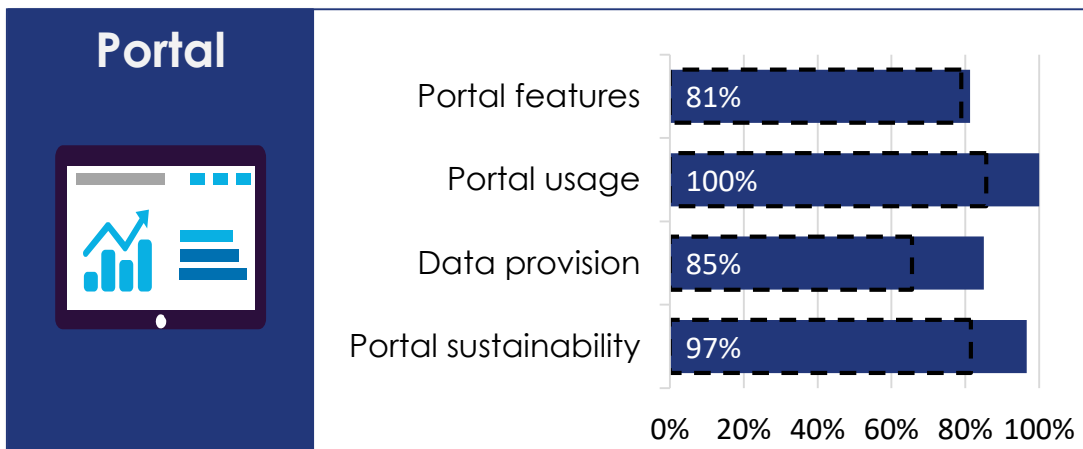
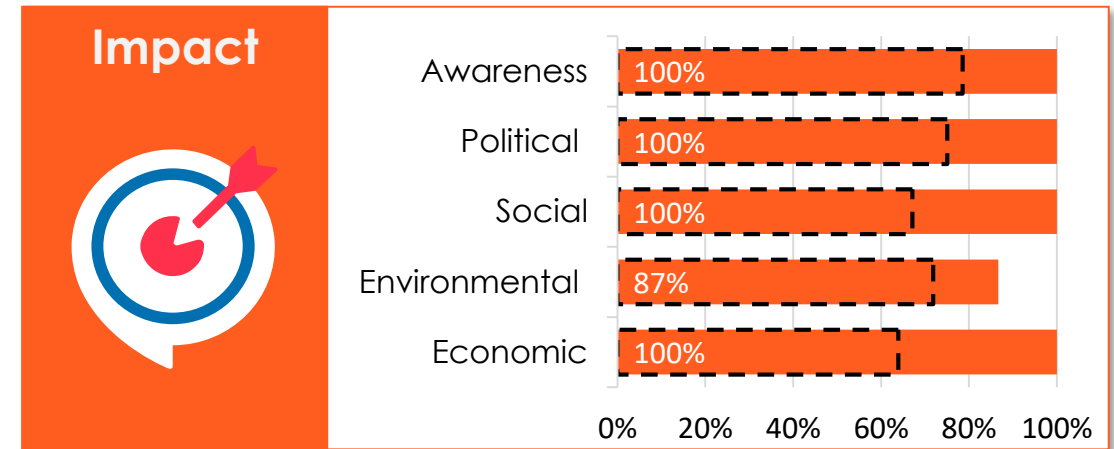
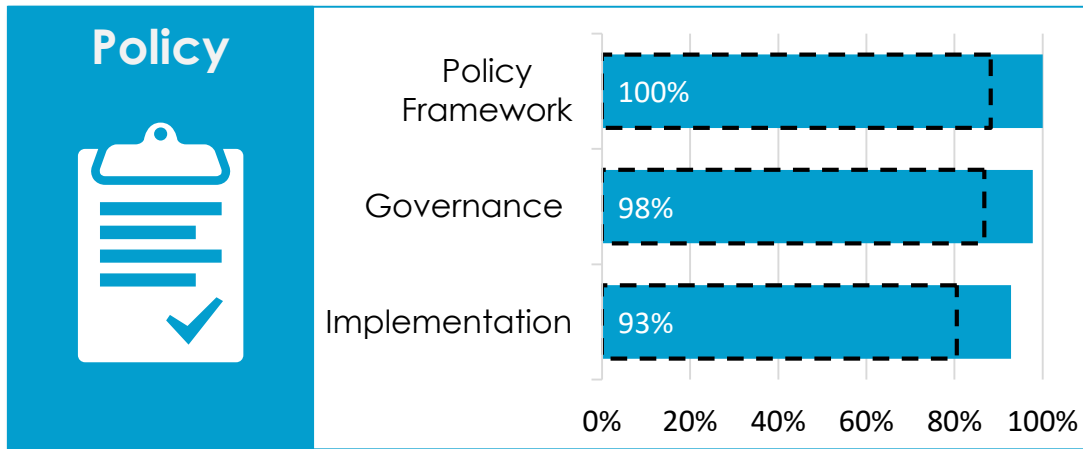

ADDRESSING BARRIERS

Barriers

Poland mentions several barriers in open data publication and re-use, such as: privacy, IP rights, confidentiality, lack of awareness among administrations, data formats and costs of API's. There are multiple projects in Poland to address these issues, such as hackathons, trainings and promotions to increase awareness and availability of open data.

Reports

In August 2020, Poland published a [report](#) on the results of the implementation of the Public Data Opening Program (PODP). The document outlines the activities carried out in 2019 to increase the quantity and quality of data available for re-use. Additionally, information on events related to the opening of public data and examples of the use of open data were indicated. The year 2019 was a period of intense analytical and monitoring activities, as well as educational, information and promotion activities.



OPEN DATA RE-USE

The national open data portal of Poland provides a designated area for [open data use cases](#) to provide further insight and inspiration into how open data can be used to create services, applications, and products. Currently, the page shows 37 open data applications.

An example of open data re-use in Poland is the application [Czynaczas](#), that shows buses and trams of public transport on the map in real time. Czynaczas also calculates the delay of each bus / tram, position on its route. The application also informs about obstacles on the route of buses or trams.

Another example is [SwiatPrzychodni.pl](#) an internet portal that facilitates the search for public health care facilities with the shortest queues, according to the slogan "Don't wait without sense!" The data on the website comes from reporting on the length of queues that are required to be run by service providers cooperating with the National Health Fund. In addition to searching for health centers, the website allows patients to share their opinions about them and provides publications on medical topics. At the end of September 2020, the portal had active profiles of over 25,000 service providers, about which users published approx. 50,000. comments.
