

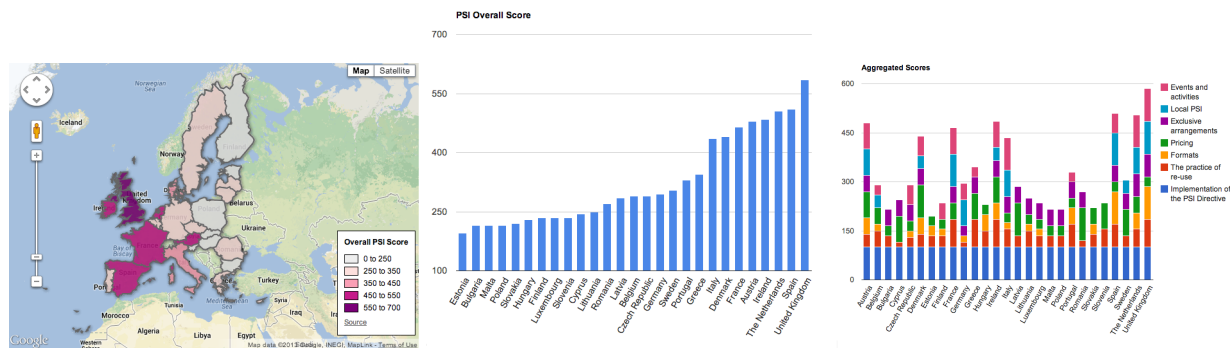
New ePSI Scoreboard Released

Today, ePSI Platform launched a new version of the [PSI Scoreboard](#), a crowdsourced tool to measure the status of Open Data and PSI re-use throughout the EU. This scoreboard aims to assess the overall PSI re-use situation, which includes the Open data community's activities, by **measuring 7 aspects of PSI re-use** with a set of 25 indicators.

New visualizations

Two charts and a map represent the total score for each nation in an intuitive way.



The map shows the Member States colored with a gradient depending on the overall score for each country, and the charts represent the overall score of each Member State with bars. One of them ordered by score, and a dynamic break-up with partial scores for each group of indicators.

A New Methodology

The scoreboard is based in the same indicators as in the previous version, but with some changes based on the [received feedback](#):

- Indicator 2.6 (Existence of national or regional data catalogue) was moved from the indicator group 3 (Formats) to group 2 (National re-use policy).
- Two additional indicators have been included: (3.4) Existence of national data catalogue(s) in machine-readable formats, and (7.4) Publication of reports on PSI re-use.
