OKF Greece signs MoU with Public Revenue General Secretariat

Public accountability has emerged as a necessity of the financial crisis.

While open data has a broad spectrum of applications, it has been obvious, especially in the recent years, that openness is a significant weapon of government policy.

In Greece, the Public Revenue General Secretariat of the ministry of Finance constantly assesses the huge datasets produced, in order to select a publishable subset. Financial open data allow citizens to directly monitor policy realization; likewise, third parties may develop applications that allow more sophisticated use and visualisation of this data.

As a side effect, the structure of the public sector is expressed in an organized representation giving food for thought to government officials.

OKF Greece has a long record of successful projects regarding Greek Open Data. The experience gained in these projects was considered valuable by the Public Revenue General Secretariat, that a MoU was signed between the two parties.
