
Proposals of OKF Greece in the public consultation of the OGP Greece National Action Plan

As part of the Open Government Partnership Initiative, the Open Knowledge Foundation Greece (OKF Greece), recently participated in the open consultation of the "Greek Action Plan for Open Governance 2014 - 2016".

On Tuesday 27 May, OKF Greece held an open workshop to discuss and propose the positions and proposals of OKF Greece in the National Action Plan. The comments and suggestions made during the event are presented below, and have also been published on the official platform Opengov.gr - both in <u>Greek</u> and in <u>English</u>.



The workshop was attended by numerous volunteers, students and distinguished professors from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and University of Macedonia, as well as a representative from the Municipality of Thessaloniki. The meeting was opened via Skype by Dr. Laura James - the CEO of the International Open Knowledge Foundation

Dr. James was followed by Dr. Charalampos Bratsas, president of the OKF Greece, who briefly presented the proposed Action plan before dividing all participants into four working groups. These groups then each explored four key actions of the Greek Action Plan for Open Governance 2014-2016.
