UK major retailers to publish figures on food waste... why not as Open Data?

Among other commitments announced by the UK retail industry at <u>A Better Retailing</u> <u>Climate launch event held on 29 January</u>, supermarkets signed up to the initiative also committed to publish their data on food waste created at the retail stage, along with annual progress reports.

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Although this may seem a major step that could help in reducing the food waste, the report "A Better Retailing Climate: Driving Resource Efficiency" issued by the British Retail Consortium says in page 52 that their ambition is "A Better Retailing Climate commitment to 2020: We will publish our total food waste figures as a sector, and report on progress."

We all know that these reports are usually delivered in PDF or HTML formats, and data are usually heavily aggregated, so I do not expect accompanying CSV or XML files, nor data access API to detailed food waste records where you could dig and compare as a consumer, e.g. which supermarket cares more about the use of our finite resources, which are the most wasted kind of products, etc.

Let's see what happens...
