With the <u>European Elections</u> now upon us, media organisations and platforms across Europe are starting to make the most of the subsequent data being released.

Following the <u>European Parliament's recent commitment</u> to release data surrounding the elections, the <u>Vote Watch Europe</u> team is providing access to (and analyzing) voting data using statistical methods. Their data is divided to three main categories: European Parliament, European Council and Policy Area.



In the Czech Republic, the <u>GeoportalPraha portal</u> allows users to see where their closest polling stations are, and provides details of how to get there.

The <u>EU Observer</u> on other hand has just published its latest projections of seats in the European Parliament, using a combination of the EP and <u>TNS Opinion</u> as sources.
